I. Area Coordinator (Region 2,4,5)

- **Lafayette Parish School District** partnership with 911 center – all schools are being remapped according to state law requirements
- **Pointe Coupee School District** completed 2nd phase of Alice training. Live ALICE activities each school site on October PD days
- **Pointe Coupee Parish** and **St. Mary Parish** have 100% schools with door buzzers and vestibules for school front office. **St. Mary** has installed weapons detection & visitor management in all schools with LCSS grant funding
- **Calcasieu Parish School District** has on-boarded all school with RAVE. Started conducting drills. Begins Outreach pilot for threat assessments on Oct. 1st
- **St. Martin Parish** will participate in phase 2 rollout for Outreach
- **Vermillion Parish** has scheduled a reunification exercise to be conducted in conjunction with community partners
- **Acadia Parish** getting emergency and visitor management programs with new LCSS funding
- **East Feliciana** did Run, Hide, Fight and BTAM overview. Full RHF training Oct. 15th

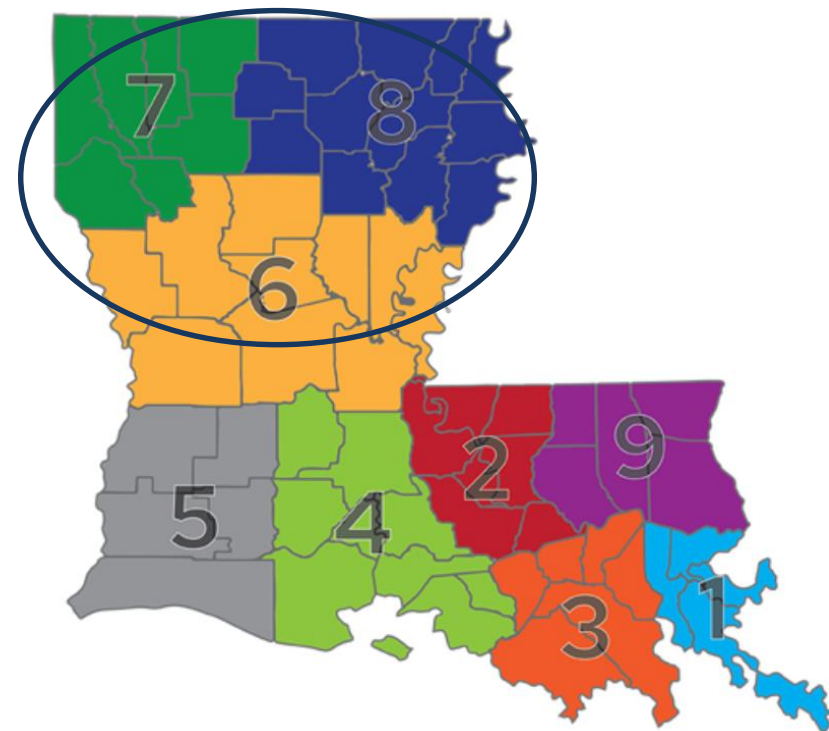




